Every \$1 donated provides 7 pounds of food to neighbors in need.

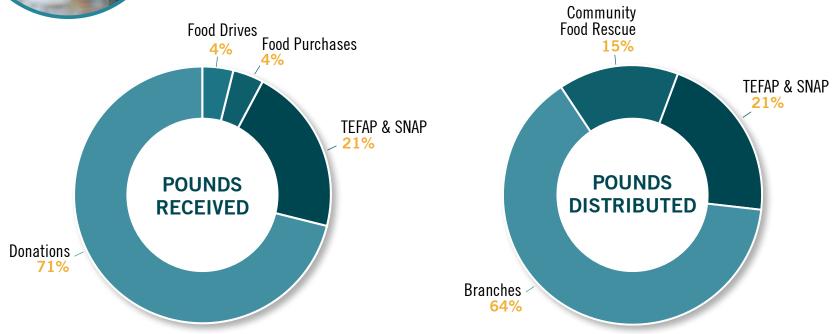




Food and fund drives provided the equivalent of more than 6.6 million pounds of food to neighbors in need.

Hurricane Florence Esponse

In September 2018, Hurricane Florence made landfall in Wilmington, NC, bringing days of flooding and power outages all over North and South Carolina. As soon as Florence stormed in, Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina's staff and volunteers went to work to help our neighboring food banks up and down the coasts of North and South Carolina. Our location in Charlotte makes us the perfect place to stockpile water, ready-to-eat foods, batteries, flashlights, and cleaning supplies for hurricane relief.

Thanks to many supporters, we were able to provide 51 tractor trailer loads through our "From Charlotte, With Love" campaign. These truck loads included food boxes we packed during several events held at our food bank along with produce, meat, paper goods, hygiene, water, diapers, and assorted food.
