### **GIVING MONEY**

While most of the food we distribute is donated, we have costs to transport and receive it, keep proper records, conduct appropriate inspections to ensure food safety, and sort and prepare the food for sharing with our partner agencies. Financial donations help to cover these costs. In 2022-2023, over 78 pounds of food was distributed to neighbors in need.





SHFBM has over 950 partner agencies including soup kitchens, emergency pantries, homeless shelters, senior programs, and low-income daycares.



In 2022-2023 Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina had 465 different programs in place dedicated to ending child hunger. Making sure every child in our region has enough to eat every day is the number one goal of our food bank.

Did YouKnow?

In 2022-2023 Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina's Second Box Program distributed 32,884 boxes full of healthy, ready-to-eat foods to 37 senior distribution sites in 16 counties.

Every \$1 donated provides 7 pounds of food to neighbors in need.

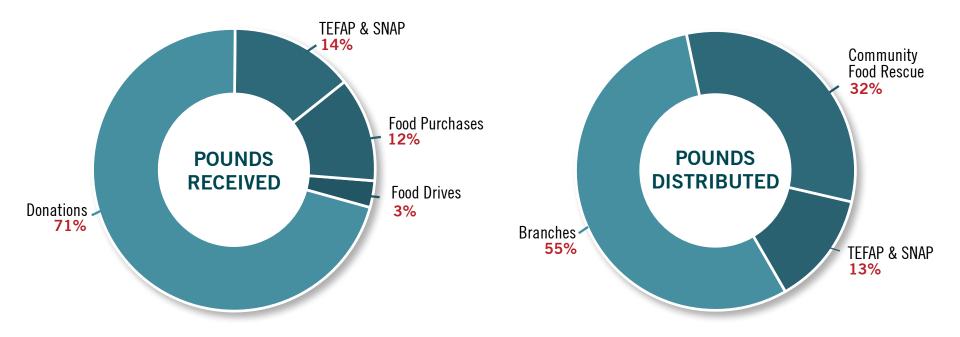
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Food and fund drives provided the equivalent of more than 9.8 million pounds of food to neighbors in need.
