# KAY'S MESSAGE



For the past three years Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina, along with food banks all across the nation, have been dealing with an experience like no other. As we work our way out of (we surely hope) the COVID years, it seems an excellent time to reflect on all we have been able to accomplish with the help of each of you reading this newsletter. In short, you all have been a tremendous asset to all of those we serve across 24 counties of North and South Carolina.

You have continued to support our efforts on behalf of so many children, families, seniors, veterans and pets - wonderful individuals and four legged friends who are depending on each of us to make sure they get the nutrition they need every day. They are depending on us to be sure they can function each day without hunger which makes it impossible for them to perform well in school, to stay out of hospitals and care facilities, to focus at their workplace, and to make sure their beloved pets stay with their families.

While these past three years have surely not been easy times for our staff at Second Harvest, they have been made infinitely better because of you. The knowledge that the community loves and supports our mission and our neighbors, has helped us move on even when days have seemed impossible.

Not only have we moved forward, the progress that is being made in feeding our community is greater than I could have ever imagined. These past three years have seen our food bank provide a record number of pounds of food to those struggling with hunger. Over 237 million pounds total with 60% of that, 142 million pounds being produce, meat and dairy. This is critical because these are the foods people most need to stay healthy but also the foods that those struggling in poverty cannot afford to obtain.

One of the goals that I became very focused on early in my tenure with the Food Bank was to be sure that we were serving all of our counties with as much food as possible. When I started in 2004, we had 16 counties - today we have 24. But the goal has remained top of mind - to be sure every county is being cared for and that every county is important in our efforts to end hunger.

With that in mind and since we are at the end of 2022, I was led to reflect on some of the activities we have been undertaking in all of our counties. This may be a little longer read than most of my messages but it is so important to highlight each of our 24 counties. We have 14 counties in North Carolina and 10 in South Carolina and this message will try and share a little something we are proud of in each of those counties. Understanding this is a fraction of what is being done in each county.

One of the more interesting things about our service region is that it is made up of counties that are very urban, counties that are very rural, counties that are very large and counties that are very small. All of them with interesting demographics and unique situations. This message will try and weave in some of that information along with some of our achievements in all of our various counties. These achievements would not be possible without our amazing partner agencies - over 950 of them in total. Obviously we cannot mention every single one, but for each one mentioned there are dozens of others who are equally engaged.

## North Carolina Counties:

**Anson County** is one of our smallest counties and also has the unfortunate distinction of having the highest child poverty rate of any county we serve. But Anson is blessed with 24 wonderful partner agencies who collectively help us distribute millions of pounds there every year. Anson Crisis hosts mobile pantries and Feed My Lambs helps us provide senior boxes and consistently takes full tractor trailer loads of food that is distributed throughout the county.

**Burke County** is one where we have been able to grow our pounds distributed exponentially. We already had tremendous agency support there with Burke United Christian Ministries, East Burke Christian Ministries and Oak Ridge Baptist. Recently we were fortunate to partner up with The Outreach Center - they have made it possible for us to deliver full tractor trailer loads of produce, meat and dairy items weekly. We drop one of our refrigerated trailers and this wonderful food is distributed all week long, every week.



**Cabarrus County** is home to 34 wonderful agency partners and with the help of many long time agencies such as CCM, Operation Bread Basket and The Salvation Army, we have been able to focus on child and senior hunger there. We host ongoing school mobile pantries at several of the local elementary schools, including Winecoff and Rocky River, and we have strong backpack and senior box programs there as well.

**Catawba County** is home to one of the Food Bank branches. While it is a tiny branch, we do as much as possible for our 29 agencies there. We are fortunate to have MDI located there and they support us with the branch facility and with annual box packing events. These thousands of boxes are packed and stay right in Catawba County. With friends like East Catawba Christian Ministry, Lake Norman Food Mission and The Corner Table, we have amazing support that enables us to distribute several million pounds per year in this county.



**Cleveland County** has a very high child and senior poverty rate and we have made these our focus areas. We have active senior box programs and backpack programs and our partner Washington Missionary serves as a hub for us to be able to distribute more pounds. They are large enough to handle tractor trailer loads and they help us take our government commodities and other food and distribute all over the county, working hand in hand with many of our 39 partners there.

**Gaston County** receives more than 5 million pounds per year from Second Harvest. The child hunger rate is high there and we depend upon partners like the West Gastonia Boys and Girls Club to help us feed kids. We had a wonderful experience there at Christmas and were able to provide not only holiday hams and food boxes but presents for all of the children at the site. We also are fortunate to have Mt. Zion working with us to take full tractor trailers of meat, produce and dairy similar to what we mentioned with Burke County.



**Iredell County** is one of two counties (along with Mecklenburg) where we are able to provide our partners with Community Food Rescue services. We have a wonderful group of long time volunteers who pick up food all over the county and deliver to our partners. We are also blessed to have Mooresville Christian there assisting us with the senior box program along with nine other wonderful agencies.

**Lincoln County** is home to our long time partners Christian Ministries and East Lincoln Christian Ministries and 11 other partners. We have been concentrating efforts in this county and have been able to consistently provide 1-2 million pounds of food there each year. They also accept tractor trailers through Christian Ministries and we have also made Lincoln a focus county for our Santa Express program which annually provides fresh fruit, school supplies and toiletries to schools all over our region including Norris S.Childrens, Love Memorial and G.E. Massey all located in Lincoln County.



**Mecklenburg County** is of course our home base at Second Harvest and also home to 323 agency partners. It is impossible to mention even a small number of these but here are a couple of highlights. Loaves and Fishes is our largest partner in Mecklenburg and we are proud to work with them to feed so many people. For the past several years we have been providing an estimated 2.3 - 2.5 million pounds of food annually to them. We have a very large school mobile pantry program in Mecklenburg benefitting many CMS elementary and middle schools. We also count as our partners, The Independence Fund which serves our veterans. With this partnership we have been able to consistently hold food distributions for those who have served our country and kept us safe. Finally our partnership with Med Assist has allowed us to provide all types of over the counter meds to those in poverty and our partnership with Crisis Assistance keeps their free store packed with clothes and household items needed by those who are struggling in poverty.

---

**Montgomery County** is one of our smallest counties but has tremendous need. Largely rural, we have made assisting seniors and children there a priority working together with CIS, Montgomery Council on Aging, and our pantry partners. We support 27 programs in Montgomery including backpack programs at every single elementary school. The county may be small but we still reach them annually with between a million and a million and a half pounds of food.

**Rowan County** has become the second home for Second Harvest this past year. Thanks to our partner Food Lion, we were able to acquire an 85,000+ square foot facility there to help ease the overcrowding at our headquarters in Charlotte. This building provides us with much needed dry space and 35,000 square feet of cooler space. We are in the process of adding a giant freezer there that will help us accept even more meat and frozen items. We are also able to stock 150 different grocery items to ensure we never run out of food as well as providing disaster relief supplies for our partner food banks on the coasts of NC, SC and GA. We plan to soon open a branch there on site to provide even better service to our almost 100 partner agencies in Rowan, Cabarrus and Stanly counties.



**Rutherford County** is one of our more rural counties and also has above average rates of child and senior hunger. We are blessed with wonderful backpack partners there who help us supply backpacks to every elementary school in the county as well as a number of middle schools. We also work closely with Chase Corners and Salem Washburn who routinely host mobiles throughout this county. With the help of our 31 partners we manage to distribute between one million and one and half million pounds annually in this county.

**Stanly County** is home to one of our long standing partners Stanly Community Christian Ministry who we work with to host food distributions throughout the county all year long. We also have an active backpack program there which we are working to expand. We also were able to provide Stanly County Animal Control with a tractor trailer load of pet food this past year to help families struggling to keep their pets. We appreciate our 32 partners in this county and look forward to expanding programs in the coming year that will help improve the rates of racial disparity there, among the highest in our NC counties.

**Union County** is home to one of our largest backpack programs working with our partner Food for Families. Backpacks are provided to dozens of elementary, middle and high schools through their support and they also help us in countless other ways. We support 58 total programs in this county including Common Heart who assists with county distributions and our government commodities program. We annually distribute close to three million pounds in Union County and recently were able to assist The Humane Society when they were running low on pet food.



## South Carolina Counties:

**Abbeville County** is one of the smallest counties we serve, but has high child and senior poverty rates. We have a small number of agencies there and the need is tremendous. Recently we were able to connect with Be Well Abbeville who have been supporting us in hosting food distributions regularly in this county. As one of our SC counties with a very high rate of racial disparity (along with Greenwood), we are working on funding to address some of these systemic issues in the coming year.

**Anderson County** is home to our branch in Williamston, one of our two branches located in Upstate SC. We have developed an amazing partnership with Anderson County United Way who helps fund our backpack program and also this past year funded a turkey distribution in the county at Thanksgiving. Working with the United Way, we participated in their nine round up meetings held throughout the county by offering food boxes and fresh produce boxes on site, resulting in thousands of families being fed county wide. We support 49 programs in Anderson County and annually distribute over two million pounds there.



**Cherokee County** also has higher than average child and senior poverty rates but working together with the Senior Center of Cherokee County and our partner food pantries, we are feeding many children and seniors. We are very proud of our fairly new partner Pure Heart, who stepped up when one of our larger partner agencies Voice of Triumph had to close. Pure Heart is helping us with government commodities distributions and we were recently able to assist them with new coolers and freezers.

**Greenwood County** as mentioned previously also has a high rate of racial disparity and we are working with 25 partners there to help improve this situation. Working with Greenwood Food Bank and our new partner Self-Regional Hospital, we have been able to host regular food distributions in this county and we hope by next year to be distributing over one million pounds per year there. Most recently we were able to assist The Salvation Army with funds to build a new walk in freezer which will enable them to receive more frozen meat, a very important protein source.

---

**Lancaster County** is home to some of our long standing food pantries including Christian Services and KARE Kershaw. We work with both of these agencies and 23 others to help provide between two and two and a half million pounds of food annually in this county. We are also fortunate with the support of The Springs Close Foundation to provide backpacks to every school in the county helping many of the 18.5% of children who live in poverty in Lancaster County.

---

**Oconee County** is home to 26 partner agencies of Second Harvest. Our partners help us with a significant backpack program in this county serving 14 schools. We are annually distributing between one million and one and a half million pounds of food in this county thanks to partners like College Street Baptist who help with our government commodities distributions. We were recently able to provide funds to this agency to buy two new freezers and an upright refrigerator to help distribute more nutritional pounds.

---

**Pickens County** is home to one of our largest backpack partners with 21 schools being supported throughout the county. The food bank annually provides over 1.5 million pounds of food in this county working with partners like 5 Point Church. We were recently able to help this partner with funds for a new two section freezer and a new two section cooler. This will help them distribute more fresh produce, meat and dairy to those in need throughout the county.

---

**Spartanburg County** is home to our second SC branch and thanks to this location, we are able to distribute between three and four million pounds of food annually in this county. Second Harvest supports 32 programs in Spartanburg and offers backpack programs and senior box programs in the county. We have many strong partners in this county including Greater Spartanburg Ministries, Greater St. James, Helping Hands Ministry of Woodruff and The Bridge at Green Street. We are looking to expand this branch to a full time, five day per week branch in 2023 to better serve our agencies there.

---

**Union County** is one of our smallest counties and also one with a very high rate of child poverty. We are working with partners there, 18 in total, to get more resources to our child and senior populations. Working with our partner, Catawba area Agency on Aging, and our local Union County Council on Aging, we are able to get food boxes and needed medical supplies to our seniors. Annually we are distributing over one million pounds in this county.

---

**York County** is last but certainly not least. Next to Mecklenburg, we annually distribute more pounds in York County than any of our other counties, over six million pounds every year. We support 110 programs in York County including providing backpacks to every elementary school in the county through partnerships with all four school districts. We also support seniors in the county through York County Council on Aging with fresh produce, monthly meal boxes and a host of other needed items. In November and December we hosted a number of events in York County to pay tribute to Anne Springs Close, one of our most generous donors who passed away in 2021. This included a shopping experience for clients served by Dorothy Day Soup Kitchen and a pantry delivery to Manna House.



Hopefully this glance into what we are doing county by county to feed those in need provided some real insight - into both the magnitude of the problem - but also into the depth of your care and concern for our neighbors. You all give me hope for 2023 and I am as excited as ever to see what we can accomplish for those in need in partnership with our Board of Directors, our staff, and all of our food donors, financial donors and volunteers.

You are truly a blessing to Second Harvest and to this region.

# Rowan Branch Grand Opening 2022



On April 20th, the Food Bank hosted our Grand Opening event at our new Rowan Branch in Salisbury, NC along with Food Lion Feeds, who donated one million dollars towards the purchase of the building. The Cannon Foundation, The Leon Levine Foundation, the Gene Haas Foundation and Blue Cross Blue Shield of NC have also provided funds to assist with the construction of a large freezer onsite. This new branch will allow better accessibility for the 130+ partner agencies that the Food Bank serves in Rowan, Stanly, and Cabarrus Counties. Following brief Grand Opening comments, there was a large volunteer packing event that took place that included groups from Food Lion, Novant Health, Atrium Health and other companies in the Salisbury area who packed over 6,000 food boxes.



# Food Lion Feeds Award Ceremony



On June 22nd, Food Lion Feeds honored a select group of food banks, volunteers, community leaders and associates at the Seventh Annual Food Lion Feeds Feedys Awards. The event recognized those who dedicate their time and talents to providing meals, resources, education and hope to neighbors battling food insecurity in the towns and cities Food Lion serves. Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina was the recipient of The Food King Award, which honors a food bank that demonstrates outstanding commitment through financial support, innovation, encouragement and motivation for others to take leadership roles in hunger-relief programming and community involvement.

# NFL Carolina Panthers Packing Event





In October 2021, they became an Ardrey Kell High School club and provided volunteer opportunities to their students through food drives, fundraisers, and other service events. Since 2020, Cans for Kids has donated over 20,000 pounds to the food bank, recruited over 150 volunteers, and contributed more than 4,000 volunteer hours. 


