

Kay's Message



January 2024 marked my 20 year anniversary as CEO of Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina. During those 20 years, I have learned an awful lot about how great the needs are out there and how many people suffer every day. I have also learned an awful lot about how giving our region is and how dedicated our supporters are to ending hunger for our children, seniors, veterans, families and pets.

During November and December our staff had the opportunity to be throughout our region hosting events and distributions for almost 60 straight days. During that time we visited soup kitchens, senior centers, veterans organizations, daycares, schools, shelters and animal rescues, all working with the same goal - to be sure no one is hungry.

Let me tell you about a few of the people I met this past holiday season.



Out at the **VA Service Center** here in Charlotte, I met Jim who served in Vietnam. I walked over to his car and shook his hand as we loaded up a holiday ham and fresh produce. As we chatted I said, "Thank you so much for your service and Jim said, "If they called me up today, I would go back again." Yet here Jim sits in a line of cars wrapped around a building waiting for holiday food.

Over in Rock Hill, I was invited to attend a talent show featuring some of the daily guests who eat their lunch meal every day at **Dorothy Day Soup Kitchen**. Every guest has a story and most have faced unthinkable tragedy in their lives - but each one who performed in the show entertained us all with a song of encouragement - some about keeping their trust in God to see them through, some about friends that have helped them, and others just songs of joy. But the recurring theme in every single performance was hope and trust that better days are around the corner.





At one of the many **senior centers** we serve, I met a special lady. We were loading up fresh produce boxes and turkeys for the Thanksgiving holiday. She leaned over and whispered to me asking if we ever get toys at the Food Bank. I said not too often and inquired about what she was looking for. She said I would like to give toys to my two great-grandchildren and I know exactly what they want. I took the list and promised to get the toys - then I said to her, what do you want for Christmas? She answered a battery for my car. I said I think Santa can bring that too. And he did.

At one of our **Head Start Centers** I watched the joy on the faces of the children there as we took Christmas gifts for each of them and food for their families. There is nothing quite like seeing the pure joy that radiates from children who are surprised with gifts that may be all they receive at Christmas. I keep those faces in my mind all the time.



The holidays are a frantic time for all of us at Second Harvest - but they are also an inspirational time. As I reflected on the folks I met throughout our region - the children, the seniors, the veterans and the families, I was reminded of how important this work is and how lucky I am to have had the opportunity to be at Second Harvest for 20 years - what a blessing it has been in my life.

As we move through 2024 I would encourage all of you to consider making a donation to help us meet the many needs that exist in our region. I would especially be honored for you to make a donation in celebration of my 20th anniversary with the Food Bank. Thank you in advance for your commitment to and compassion for those in need. With your help, 2024 will be a better year for so many of our neighbors.




Our Report




Chef's Best 2023

Joy to the Carolinas 2023










Bozeman's Thanksgiving Bash 2023






Food Lion and Charlotte Hornets Packing Event
