📀 MESSAGE FROM KAY

For the past several years we have used our post-holiday Blessings as a photo book recalling some of our most special holiday moments as we worked to build awareness of hunger in our region. This year's photo book is our largest one yet thanks to each of you who helped us through your financial donations, your food drives and food donations and by volunteering your time. From golfers to grocers, from chefs to churches, from attorneys to architects, from banks to bikers, from farms to festivals, from Panthers to physicians, from Hornets to hair stylists, from students to singers, from retailers to real estate agents, from engineers to electricians, and everything in between, you helped us feed so many hungry children, seniors and families.

It is my honor to be able to introduce you to a handful of the hundreds of thousands of lives you touched this year. The photos on the opposite page show a few of the real life people we had the great fortune to help this year and I want to use this message to tell you about a few other special paths we crossed. Your generosity was the difference in their lives.

My thoughts go to the little girl I met at Oak Lawn Head Start. Each year we adopt this site located right around the corner from the food bank and take supplies for the teachers and gifts for the students and food boxes and turkeys and hams for the families. This particular little girl, about 4 years old, was sitting quietly while all the other children in her class tore into their backpacks full of presents. I sat down beside her and quietly encouraged her to look in her backpack. Her eyes began to light up as she pulled out a new hat and gloves, a play make-up kit, coloring books, sunglasses and a special toy – she looked at me and asked, "Do I get to take all of this home?"

My thoughts go to the 95 year old veteran I met at one of our senior centers in York County. He has been coming to the center for years for both the food and the fellowship. He recently made the decision that he cannot drive there anymore and now he is receiving his meals on a home delivered meal route.

My thoughts go to the second grader we met at Montclaire Elementary School. He had just arrived a few weeks earlier with his family from Honduras. The school staff shared with us that they had yet to see him smile, he was a very sad little boy. But when our staff handed out bags of apples to the children he was beaming. The staff was amazed but we were not – we see every day how little things we take for granted are very important to so many people in our community. This sad little boy transformed in an instant and has the biggest smile in the class photos we made.

My thoughts go the school nurse we met at one of our highest poverty rate elementary schools in Charlotte. We met her the day we delivered fresh peaches for every student at the school. She was crying as the peaches were being rolled in because she was so excited that her kids were going to get healthy fruit that day.

My thoughts go to two of the senior ladies we met who live alone with only their beloved pets for company. For so many of us, pets are a big part of our families. For these seniors, pets provide a reason to keep on keeping on. Their pets need them



and provide valuable encouragement and companionship. These seniors receive pet food that insures their pets eat the right food for them while our seniors are eating the balanced meals delivered for them by our mobile meals programs.

My thoughts go to the husband, wife and three year old son who are homeless. The husband is at a men's shelter while the wife and young son are at a women's shelter. The husband walks two miles a day from his shelter to the wife's shelter and on to a soup kitchen just so they can have a meal together each day.

My thoughts go to the sweet senior I met while touring one of the senior housing complexes we work with throughout our region. This amazing lady had worked her entire life in cotton mills without the benefit of very much formal education. She is struggling with COPD and a variety of other health issues but she feels very lucky to be in a place where kind people check on her every day and where her meals are delivered to her every day. Her response when asked the importance of these meals was, "Oh honey, I wouldn't get one if they didn't bring me one."

I could go on and on with stories just like these if space would permit me to do that. Please don't ever doubt how much your support means to Second Harvest but especially how much it means to hundreds of thousands of people just like these you have met today. We are so grateful for your support as we move into 2016 and I wish you and your family a year of blessings.



Thanks to you we are no longer hungry.

STUDENT HUNGER DRIVE



This year's Student Hunger Drive featured 16 high schools from Mecklenburg, Cabarrus and York County competing to see which schools could raise the most pounds per student. The 2015 drive was the most successful yet raising 263,740 total pounds for Second Harvest and our partner emergency pantries in these three counties. The pounds raised this year have brought the six year total for this amazing youth led drive to over 800,000 pounds!

On September 15, 2015, at the Second Harvest warehouse in Charlotte, Family Dollar announced the donation of 2.9 million meals to Feeding America Food Banks across the nation. On September 22, 2015, East Lincoln Christian Ministry received a Pantry Makeover courtesy of Food Lion Feeds and Second Harvest Food Bank. As part of Hunger Action Month in September, Food Lion and Second Harvest staff cleaned, painted, replaced shelving and purchased new sinks, a new freezer and filled the shelves with food and non-food for this important partner agency in Lincoln County. Food Lion sponsored a total of 38 makeovers all through the states they serve.

RHI Legacy Foundation in Rutherford County has become the Food Bank's most important partner in ending child hunger in that community. Over the past two years, this amazing foundation has helped increase the weekly number of backpacks going in to this high need county from 220 per week to 410 per week.

John Bennett, a local high school student, selected the Rutherford County Backpack Program as his senior project. John worked with his personal contacts at Truck Services to arrange the pick up and storage of the backpacks every two weeks. This is a huge cost savings for the school district there and for the Food Bank. There are so many amazing people in our region doing so much amazing work – we are proud to be partners with RHI Legacy and John.









Second Harvest partner TJX Companies called on the food bank to nominate an agency that could use some help in Stanly County. Thanks to this amazing foundation, Stanly Community Christian Ministry was honored with a \$5,000 check at the most recent new store opening in Albemarle, NC.

Thanks to our wonderful grocery partner Food Lion, we were able to surprise Backpack Ministries in Union County, NC with a truckload of most needed items for their backpack program. The food was delivered on August 6th just in time for the start of school. Backpack Ministries works with Second Harvest to distribute 1,430 backpacks each month at 4 local schools including Antioch Elementary, South Providence School, Rocky River Elementary and Western Union Elementary.





NOVANT THANKSGIVING DAY PARADE





Second Harvest was honored again this year to be the official charity of the Novant Thanksgiving Day Parade. This is one of the most amazing events held in Charlotte and in partnership with Food Lion and Center City Partners, the food bank not only participates but gets to help feed families as well.

With the assistance of Compass Group and Food Lion, Second Harvest was able to provide turkeys with all the fixings to 500 local families that otherwise would not have had a Thanksgiving Day meal.



SECOND HARVEST GOLF TOURNAMENT

The Second Annual Second Harvest Golf Tournament was held at Gaston Country Club on October 26th. The tournament supports the food bank's child hunger programs in Cherokee, Cleveland, Gaston, Lincoln and York counties and this year's tournament raised almost \$25,000 to help feed hungry children in these counties.

- Almost 118,000 people, representing 17% of the population, live in poverty.
- Almost 11,000 seniors, 11.5% of all individuals over the age of 65, live in poverty.
- Over 42,000 children, 28% of all individuals under the age of 18, live in poverty.
- Second Harvest distributed 9.8 million pounds of food and household items to 140 partner agencies in 2014-2015.
- Second Harvest sponsors 36 child and senior hunger programs.

NORTH CAROLINA STATE EMPLOYEE'S CREDIT UNION DONATION



The North Carolina State Employee's Credit Union has stepped up in a big way to help North Carolina food banks in their quest to end hunger in our state. In August, SECU Foundation Board Chair McKinley Wooten, Jr. announced a donation of \$1.2 million to the six North Carolina food banks to be paid out over the next three years. The donation will help the food banks collectively provide 6 million meals to hungry North Carolinians.

Wooten stated, "On behalf of SECU members, we are delighted to be partnering with the NC Association of



Feeding America Food Banks to provide much needed assistance for local citizens and bring more awareness to the issue of hunger."

SANTA EXPRESS



On December 7, 2015, Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina and Wal-Mart announced a new annual partnership called the "Santa Express." For two and a half weeks leading up to Christmas, Second Harvest trucks delivered fresh fruit, pallets of canned goods and staple items, hygiene items, socks, diapers, uniforms, school supplies, refrigerators and freezers and toys to 37 different high poverty elementary schools and partner emergency pantries, soup kitchens and shelters.


The Kick Off Event for Santa Express was held at the York County Council on Aging and included a celebration of the 90th birthday of Anne Springs Close, a local philanthropist and long-time advocate in the fight against hunger in Chester, Lancaster and York counties. In honor of Anne's 90th birthday Wal-Mart helped Second Harvest distribute 9,000 bags of fresh fruit to homebound seniors and at risk elementary school students.

Between December 7 and December 23, the Santa Express powered by Wal-Mart provided the following resources to our region:

- Visited 14 different counties in North and South Carolina
- Assisted 37 different high poverty elementary schools and partner agencies in the region
- Helped provide food, toys and school supplies for 11,000 at risk elementary school students
- Distributed 9,000 bags of fresh fruit
- Distributed 2 tractor trailer loads (52 pallets) of toys
- Distributed 5,000 pairs of socks

Plans are already underway for the 2016 Santa Express. We promise it will be even bigger and better than the 2015 event!

HUNGER ACTION MONTH EVENTS

September is Hunger Action Month and Second Harvest Food Bank and Feeding America hosted many events to draw attention to this critical issue. In the region served by the food bank here in Charlotte, 18.1% of the population including 190,000 children struggle with hunger.

HUNGER ACTION MONTH...

ACN FOOD DRIVE:

Thanks to our friends at ACN for collecting tuna for us during their sales conference held at Time Warner Cable Arena. Their efforts resulted in the collection of almost a thousand pounds of this most needed item.



MICROSOFT:

The software engineers at Microsoft helped us pack 600 backpacks for distribution to hungry children in our region as part of Hunger Action Month. We appreciate their support!



NEW BACKPACK PROGRAMS:

Thanks to our partner agency Assistance League for helping the Food Bank start new backpack programs at Billingsville Elementary and Merry Oaks Elementary. A kick-off event at each school was held to announce the programs and Food Lion also provided bags of fresh apples for each student at the schools to take home. We appreciate the dedication of the Assistance League in helping us end child hunger in the Charlotte area.







BELK BOWL



Each year Bank of America Stadium is home to the Belk Bowl which features an ACC team competing with an SEC team. For the past two years teams have worked in a trip to volunteer at the food bank while they are in town for the big game. On December 28, 2015, we were honored to have the entire teams and coaching staffs from North Carolina State University and Mississippi State University here at the food bank helping us pack 2,400 backpacks, every one of which will feed a hungry child in our region.

Special thanks to the folks from Mississippi State who also made a \$500 financial donation to Second Harvest!

DP WORLD

On December 8, 2015, our friends from DP World, made their second major equipment donation to Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina. The Charlotte office was part of the wider Global Volunteer Week initiative ran by DP World from December 6-11. This worldwide initiative features DP World employees volunteering on multiple continents.

In addition to volunteering at the food bank throughout the year, DP World surprised us with a baler, electric stand-up forklifts and electric and manual pallet jacks. SPOTLIGHT ON HEALTHY CHOICES

This past year 17 million of the over 46 million pounds we distributed were produce, meat and dairy items. These are the foods most needed to stay healthy but also those individuals struggling with hunger cannot afford to purchase. We depend upon amazing partners like those on this page to help supply us with fresh produce, milk, eggs and meat.



Titan Peaches and Harris Teeter partnered again in 2015 for their third annual "Peaches with a Purpose" campaign. This year's donation took place at Second Harvest on August 26th. Many thanks to these great partners for donating 16,200 pounds of fresh peaches. These peaches ended up in the hands of at-risk elementary school students in our region as well as in emergency pantries.





In October, Perdue donated a tractor trailer load of protein



packed chicken along with a \$5,000 Foundation Donation to our food bank. The funds were used to help sponsor school based mobiles at Winecoff Elementary School in Cabarrus County where Perdue is located. Many thanks to the Perdue employees who came out and helped volunteer at the mobiles!


PET PARADISE STEPS UP AGAIN THIS YEAR TO HELP US FEED HUNGRY PETS:


